We have covered so many fun topics from space to under the sea and dinosaurs and it has been wonderful seeing all of the children immerse themselves in these topics in their own way.

This week some of the children enjoyed their transitions to their new classes and those who are staying with me next year were able to meet some of our new friends and we enjoyed a 'Dear Zoo' Sensory Story, lots of sensory play and exploring the classroom!

The children have also been getting really creative and messy this week as we have been doing lots of artwork with paint and glitter using both tools and our hands to create some wonderful masterpieces. We have also enjoyed lots of time in our garden, playing in the sandpit, and exploring a variety of containers to make different sized sandcastles and using natural resources to decorate them.



Rabbit class have had an amazing year and term. We have made some great progress and have enjoyed learning through our sensory stories, exploring different textures, sounds and smells. During our PE sessions we have learnt to play ball games and work together to play catch. Have had some lovely dance session using ribbons and scarfs, and have really enjoyed the outside area. In our creative art sessions, we have made art work to link with our topic and story and enjoyed decorating our own kites and flying them. We have created some lovely art work and have enjoyed getting messy. Our phonics session we have looked at the sounds in the environment and musical instruments. We have been making good friendships within our class and have enjoyed playing games like chase and catch. We have also worked really hard on sharing the trampoline and seesaw and have enjoyed playing on these with our friends.

Yesterday Hedgehog class had an amazing trip to the zoo. The children had a wonderful time and made the school very proud. It has been a busy week but we have still managed to recap on all of the phonics we have learnt this year and continued with measuring in maths. In PE we performed our rainforest dance and played goalball.

This year has been a phenomenal year and the children have tried so hard. They should all be so proud of their achievements. Have an awesome summer!



This term we have had a wonderful time exploring key aspects of all of Roald Dahl's stories. We have floated balloons around like Matilda, felt bumpy witch (twiglet) fingers, popped bubbles with the BFG and tasted James' giant peach! The children did fantastic work using their eyes and hands to let us know what they thought of different resources and stories through labelling items and asking for more and stop! The light up balloons and bubbles were a definite favourite. Children showed they could pop bubbles using their hands or eyes on an eyegaze!

Cause and effect skills has been another favourite this term with children developing confidence and awareness when working with switches, touch screens, instruments and eyegaze. A favourite has been kinetic sand - helping create then squash sandcastles. Everyone was fascinated by the texture and some children even added jewels for additional detail! We have also loved using the touch screen to create our own stories, puzzles and fireworks!

Number songs has shown children looking at each of a small set of objects in turn or feeling individual items within objects, demonstrating awareness that a set is made of individual, separate items. Some children have even shown they are transferring this skill to choosing from symbols, looking at each option in turn before dwelling on one!

We have done this and so much more this term and are so proud of everything the children have achieved. Team Dormouse wishes everyone a fantastic Summer and are so looking forward to seeing you all in September!



In phonics the children have continued to learn through our monster phonics scheme. They have used the skills they have learnt to help them with recognising sounds and reading words and even sentences. I have been so proud of the progress the children have made this term in phonics. They seem to think the characters are members of our class. Please use your parent login to access the reading materials and games over the summer to keep the children engaged.

In maths we have looked at weights and measure. The children have measured and weighed nearly everything in the classroom and around the school. The have really enjoyed using the maths language such as heavier and lighter, longer and shorter, to describe and compare objects and people.

The children are experts at goal ball now and they have really embraced learning a new sport. We were so lucky to have children from another school come in to show us the game. The children have learnt some excellent listen and reaction skills from goal ball. Move momentum has got the children jiggling and wiggling to a variety of music from the seaside or pirate songs.

We have made regular trips to the school pond so the children could watch their tadpoles grow and change into frogs. I was so surprised at how all the children got stuck in and they were able to see the difference in the tadpoles as they slowly changed to frogs. I am sure the frogs will be pleased of some peace and quiet over the summer holidays!

Started in our topic last term we have grown a variety of different plants and vegetables from seed. The children have enjoyed caring for and nurturing their plants and they should all come home with something that they have grown to plant at home.




Emails will be monitored between 8:00am – 3:45pm, Monday – Friday during term time only by admin staff
