I hope you are all well and have had a relaxing summer break. It is hard to believe that we are now in Autumn term!!

It was wonderful to welcome the children back to school last week and to welcome some new children who have joined us in Squirrel class and Dormouse Class. We also welcome two new members of staff: Claire, who is currently working as an LSA in Hedgehog Class and Grace who is currently working as an LSA in Dormouse Class.

During our three inset days this year, we had the following:

The children are thoroughly enjoying being back at school with their friends and those who have moved to a different class have settled in extremely well.

Our Move Momentum dance classes and Relax Kids started this week. It was wonderful to see the children having fun.

We also welcome Kathy, our music teacher from Hampshire County Council, who will be with us every Thursday morning, teaching music to each class. We are so impressed at how she has differentiated the lessons to cater for the needs of each class.

Now let's hear about what the children have been learning this week.



What a fabulous week we have had in Squirrel class. Our new children have settled so nicely and have been starting to learn all about our routines. We have been doing lots of work on ourselves, using mirrors to identify our features and then using natural resources that we found in the garden to create some amazing self-portraits. Once these were finished, we starting looking at the symbols and words for each of the features and labelling up our self-portraits.

The children have also enjoyed lots of enrichment this week. We had Relax Kids on Tuesday, where the children were able to enjoy calming music, sensory toys and practised mindfulness. On Thursday we had a music teacher in, the children explored a variety of instruments and Friday we had Move Momentum - an accessible dance class filled with lots of engaging resources such as bubbles, pom poms and the children's absolute favourite - the parachute!

This week in Dormouse class we have begun our explorations of how we use our body in earnest. We have continued our texture carousel exploring hard, loose textures and selecting our favourites to make a collage. Favourites included tiny macaroni and coco pops! We also had our first peripatetic music class with our visiting musician Cathleen and especially enjoyed exploring her ukulele and joining in with Colonel Hathi's elephant march using ocean drums, bongos and switch drums!



Hedgehog class have settled back into school well and Dani is very proud of them. In PHSE we have started exploring our emotions through art and charades. In phonics we have been re-capping on our sounds using games. In maths we have been measuring in millilitres whilst having lots of water play. The children have also made some visits to the school library this week. Today they have taken part in a Relax Kids session where the children were able to enjoy calming music and practised mindfulness and Move Momentum - an accessible dance class.



What a lovely start to the new school year, Badger class children have come back so happy and ready to learn.

In phonics we are looking at environmental sounds, exploring the school environment and listening carefully to the vehicles, animals and other noises we can hear. We have also been looking at the 'er' grapheme and finding it in words such as better, under, summer, winter, sister ask the children if they can think of any more.

In maths we have been looking at capacity and volume. We have been using a variety of jugs, cups, syringes and pots to discover full, half full and empty. We also have discussed 'ml'/'l' means millilitres/litres and how we use these to measure different things such as medicines and liquids for cooking. When you are measuring any liquids at home, please talk to the children about it and when you are shopping get them to spot the measurements on the different bottles in the shops.

In PSHE and music we are focusing on our emotions. We are reading lots of stories about emotions and practicing making the faces and sounds relating to different emotions. Please practice the 'guess the emotions' game at home. Make a face and see if the children can guess what emotion you are feeling.

We have also started our RE topic of thankfulness and we will be asking the children to think of things they are thankful for.

I would like to thank you for your continued support and I hope you all have a wonderful weekend.


Emails will be monitored between 8:00am – 3:45pm, Monday – Friday during term time only by admin staff
