During my learning walks this week, I have been so impressed with the children's learning.

Each of our classes has a bespoke learning pathway to ensure all learners achieve. It really is a pleasure and an honour to watch them thrive.

Our Chair of Governors, Alan Rowden, has accompanied me with some of these learning walks and he has been equally impressed with our children. Of course, this can only happen under the direction of our fantastic team of staff. A big thank you to each and every one of you.

Now let's find out what the children have been learning.



This week Squirrel Class have been enjoying a new book. We have been reading Goldilocks and the Three Bears and the children absolutely love this story! We took our learning a bit further and made porridge this week, exploring the concept of hot and cold. Whilst we waited for our porridge to cool we explored lots of different toppings to put on our porridge, looking at nice and not so nice toppings. The children of course all chose the nice toppings which were honey and chocolate. We continued with some more food related learning this week when we made teddy bear toast. We included our number awareness into this learning by adding three slices of banana and 3 blueberries to make the bears face. We have also been exploring the 'b' sound and finding things that start with this sound such as bear, banana and blueberries.



In phonics this week Rabbit are exploring the letter 'M'. Exploring this letter using cued articulation and Mark making. In Literacy we have been exploring the sensory story 'Brown Bear What do you see'. Using 4 of our senses, looking, touching, listening, and smelling different objects and materials to help us understand the story. In art we have been making a card using our hands to create a beautiful colourful flower.

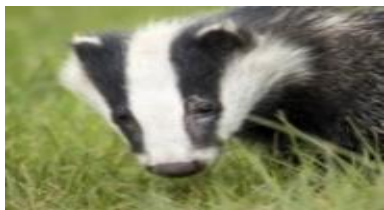
Music is one of our favourite lessons, we love exploring different instruments and the different sounds they make.

We really enjoy our move momentum sessions. We love moving to the music, using ribbons, bubbles, and pom poms. The best part is the parachute at the end.

We are completing our 1:1 task every day and working hard on our focus and attention in bucket time.

Badger class have been working so hard this week, they have been counting and grouping numbers, talking about 'lots of' and counting in 2's and 10's. The children have been exploring musical instruments and making sounds to match pictures. They have also been looking at Miss oh No sounds and playing matching games (words to pictures). They have been sounding out 'ow' words in groups too.
