I hope you are all well.

This week has been a busy week at school.

We have already started planning our Christmas activities, including some Christmas themed trips out for the children. More details to follow.

We are also in the midst of finalising our Christmas Production, with the focus on Christmas Around the World.

On Monday 13th November, we get this off to a fantastic start with a Theatre company performing Beauty and the Beast at school. Lots of exciting events to look forward to!!





The first part of this week, Squirrel Class have been learning about Diwali. We enjoyed listening to the story of Rama and Sita and learning about this celebration and why light is so important. We explored lots of resources and artefacts such as jewellery and Diya lamps and created Rangoli patterns using different coloured counters and bingo dabbers to help develop our fine motor skills and awareness of pattern.


The second part of the week we have been learning about Remembrance Day and what the poppy symbolises. We have been making our own poppy suncatchers, clay poppies and had a go at printing with sponges and corks to make some lovely poppy paintings.

In phonics we have been learning all about the 'a' sound and recapping the 's' sound. If you can help your child with these sounds at home, pointing out objects that start with the sounds that would really help them with their learning. In maths we have been exploring empty and full, using resources such as cups with rice or water to really understand the concept.



In Rabbit class we have had a great time exploring different activities using the fireworks theme. We have enjoyed our music sessions and loved moving our bodies to the music in Move Momentum as well as our bucket time sessions and our phonic and maths songs.

Badger and Hedgehog class have been learning all about the moon landing in their topic on Space. In maths they have continued with place value and ordering numbers. In phonics Badger have focussed on the Tricky Witch sound 'oo' and Hedgehog 'ea'. In art the children have been busy making poppies in remembrance of people who help us and have very much enjoyed coming into school today dressed as their favourite super heroes. Today is also Move Momentum which is always a favourite. This afternoon the children will be making moon sand as part of friendship Friday.







This week Dormouse Class have begun exploring our topic of Birthdays in more detail. After the fun of last week's mini unit on Halloween and Bonfire Night we began our focus sensory story of "Five Rules for a Birthday Wish" by Beth Ferry (which we have adapted from her original of Ten Rules for a Birthday Wish." Children explored singing candles and party poppers, admired their reflection or felt their Braille initial and especially enjoyed exploring a cupcake each! Children were fascinated with how it crumbled under their fingers!

We have also continued to explore the concept of "one" through removing and adding one to sets in number songs - our adapted song "Five birthday cakes in a baker's shop", gaining and losing our playdough birthday cakes.

All of the children, this week, have taken part in a Remembrance assembly where we listened to the Last Post, watched the poppies fall and had a go at recreating that themselves. We have been so impressed with the children's focus and engagement while exploring this somewhat complex concept!


Emails will be monitored between 8:00am – 3:45pm, Monday – Friday during term time only by admin staff
