Dear Parents and Carers

I hope you are all well.

This week is Children's Mental Health Week. We supported this by carrying out some lovely wellbeing sessions with the children at school which everyone enjoyed. It is good to have the opportunity to just stop and relax from our busy school life. We also continue to have our Relax sessions taking place throughout the school. Each class has a half term block of sessions. When I visited dormouse Class today, they were very chilled and relaxed during their session.

Not forgetting staff wellbeing, I have introduced a weekly 'Hug in a mug', where a member of staff receives a mug full of tea, coffee and chocolate, for doing something amazing. All of our staff are amazing, but this week's 'Hug in a mug' went to Dianne Wright for delivering some training to staff. I wonder who will be next to be recognised for amazing work!!

Thank you so much for supporting us in celebrating Chinese New Year. The children have been learning about Chinese New Year and taken part in some themed activities.

Now, let's find out what the classes have been learning this week



Badger class have enjoyed listening to the story 'The Colour Monster', after they thought about different emotions and what might make them feel a certain way. They also came up with ideas of what they could do when they feel sad or angry such as doing some calming breathing and listening to their favourite song. Badger's also thought about things they could do to make other people feel happy such as using kind words and smiling at them. They then wrote and decorated some beautiful 'Kindness Postcards' where they wrote a compliment to someone to make them feel happy!



Hedgehog class have enjoyed a day of Egyptian art as part of their topic making fridge magnets and necklaces. In phonics they have continued to work on compound words. In science they have looked at forces and have been investigating friction. The children have celebrated Chinese New Year this week and have learnt all about the Chinese custom. Today they are making fruit stick fireworks.



Fox class have been practising their number songs using frogs and ducks. In phonics they used farm animals to practice their sounds. In literacy they have continued with the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears using big chairs and small bears. As we have been celebrating Chinese New Year this week the children have been busy making lanterns and have cooked noodles and spring rolls.





Dormouse Class have rounded off the half term in style. Tuesday saw the children come in wearing wonderful space outfits! We saw everything from starry sparkles to star wars to a fully fledged astronaut! There were even a few aliens among the staff! The children created wonderful space paintings using different textured "planet" balls and sprinkled starry glitter all over their night sky as a finishing touch. On Wednesday we enjoyed a Wellbeing day where we all dressed in our cosiest, comfiest clothes, watched our favourite shows and enjoyed massages under sensory lighting with relaxing music. We have loved our Space topic and can't wait to start next term's unit on Flowers and other plants!

Team Dormouse wishes you all a wonderful half term and would love any photos sent in of you and your family enjoying yourselves. Can we also ask, if possible, that we be emailed a clear, head and shoulders shot individually of each of the key people in your child's life so we can chat about them with the children. Squirrel Class have been finishing their topic on 'Polar Regions'. This week in maths the children continued to deepen their number knowledge between 0-5. They've been listening to 5 little penguins to support their learning. They have been practicing number recognition, matching numbers and matching numbers to quantities through topic related play and activities. In literacy they have been listening to 'The curious polar bear' sensory story. They practiced character recognition and sequencing story cards. In phonics they listened to initial sounds (s, a, t, p, i, n) and were matching sounds to pictures. The children made lots of mark making throughout the week, and on Friday they did Chinese New Year related art and craft.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support and I hope you all have a good half term break.

I look forward to welcoming the children back to school on Monday 19th February.


Emails will be monitored between 8:00am – 3:45pm, Monday – Friday during term time only by admin staff
