## Weekly Newsletter – 23rd February 2024

**Dear Parents and Carers** 

I hope you are all well.

This week I have thoroughly enjoyed visiting each class. The children are always so enthusiastic about their learning and it is a joy to see how staff carefully differentiate learning in each class to suit the needs of each and every child.

Some classes have been setting up role play corners in their classrooms this week. This has captured the children's imagination and many have been engaged in learning through play for longer periods of time.

**Superheroes** - We only need to walk into a toy shop or turn on our TVs to see superhero toys or cartoon and film characters. But real superheroes don't have special powers to make them fly or become invisible. Real superheroes are right here in Saxon Wood School. Our wonderful children deal with so much, but they show resilience every day. Some have rare diseases, others have other complex needs. They are the real-life superheroes and always will be.

To show just how wonderful our children are, we will mark Rare Disease Day, which is on 29<sup>th</sup> February, by dressing up as superheroes. Children can dress up as their favourite superhero, however, please do not go to any expense, as they can also come to school as themselves and still be their very own superhero!!



Badger have enjoyed starting their new focus book 'Oi Frog!'. They have had lots of fun matching the animal to what they sit on. Each animal and seat rhymes. Some of our favourites so far are 'lizards sit on wizards' and 'parrots sit on carrots'. Badgers have also enjoyed their new role play area which link with the book and their new science topic - amphibians. In the role play area is a little 'pond' with some toy frogs and some fish too! They have enjoyed using magnifying glasses to get a closer look and using nets to see if they can pick up a frog to pop it back on a Lilypad. We have also started a new Geography topic all about our local area and talked about all of the different things we might see in Basingstoke like houses, shops and swimming pools! Well done Badger for a brilliant first week back at school!



Hedgehog class have started their new topic on "A Bug's Life." We have been looking at different minibeasts and have been on a bug hunt around our outside area to see if we can find out where they live. We then used our knowledge to practise our literacy skills of descriptive words and wrote simple sentences describing the bugs. In phonics we have drawn on our knowledge of grapheme's we have learnt to help us sound out words in our reading. In Maths some children have worked on 1 more and 1 less and some have looked at the line of symmetry in reflected shapes.



Fox class have enjoyed starting their new topic of "In the garden." They have continued practising their maths number songs and in literacy have started sequencing the story of "Jack and the Beanstalk." In Art they have very much enjoyed making butterflies and dream catchers to decorate the classroom.



Dormouse Class have really got into our new topic on "How a flower grows". Our exploratory sessions this week have focussed around seeds. We have explored Tuff Trays containing tiny, hard seeds and bowls of (taste safe) "soil" in the form of crushed Oreos. The children had a wonderful time feeling the two resources separately and then using their hands to explore and combine them to try planting their seeds, experiencing the concept of "in." In our art lessons we used handfuls of seeds to squeeze into lard in order to create our own bird feed balls. These are now firming up nicely and are going to be hung in our garden when set to attract some of the local feathered wildlife.



Our new topic in Squirrel class for this half term is 'In the garden'. We started our topic with 'The very hungry caterpillar' story which was enjoyed a lot by everyone in the class. In maths the children continued to deepen their number recognition between 0-5. In literacy the children have been getting to know the characters from 'The very hungry caterpillar' and learning how to sequence the story. In literacy we continued to practice 'satpin' letter recognition.


Emails will be monitored between 8:00am – 3:45pm, Monday – Friday during term time only by admin staff
