Dear Parents and Carers

I hope you are all well.

Thank you for supporting us in recognising Rare Diseases Day yesterday. It was delightful to see the children in their superhero costumes. I particularly liked those costumes who acknowledged our real-life heroes, dressed up as doctors and nurses.

Our governing Body currently has vacancies for parent governors. Thank you to those who have expressed an interest. Next week we will send out an application form for all interested parents to complete.

As you may be aware, we have a golden coin system at Saxon Wood. If a child has worked hard, or done something amazing, then they can earn gold coins. These coins are then placed into our special golden coin box. When this is full, we have a whole school treat. Previous treats have been, a whole school disco or a pantomime. Because all our children have been working hard, our golden coin box has filled up again. The children have decided they would like a whole school party. We plan to have a big party over the next couple of weeks. Children can also have a choice of something to eat from McDonald's. For those children who cannot eat by mouth, we will provide a little gift for them. Full details will be sent out to you later next week.



I have carried out a few learning walks this week. Children have been engaged in their work and others have been trying so hard during their physio sessions. It is wonderful to see.



Badgers have enjoyed doing more activities related to our focus book 'Oi Frog'. We explored rhyming words further and the children did a fantastic job at choosing the correct rhyming word to match a picture out of 3 possible choices! They then blew us all away by coming up with lots of extra rhyming words for some of the pictures! In maths, they have continued to work hard on finding 1 more and 1 less than a given number. In Science, we have learnt about the characteristics of a frog such as that they are cold blooded and lay eggs! We have also been very lucky to see some frogspawn and will be able to observe it over time. Children have also really impressed us by demonstrating some great resilience during the week when trying something new or doing something that they found tricky - well done Badger Class!



In Hedgehog class this week some children in Maths have been learning addition without grouping with 2-digit numbers and showing their working out. Others have been learning one more and one less and the months of the year. In our Phonics sessions the Children have been revisiting graphemes taught to give them confidence and to help them with spelling when writing captions and sentences. For our science and topic work the children enjoyed going on a bug hunt but was not very successful due to only finding 2 mini beasts! We will be going on many more this half term which the children are looking forward to. We have been learning all about their habitats and microhabitats. In PE we have been following instructions by following someone else's lead and moving different parts of our body at the same time. In PHSE we have continued to work on friendships and the children presented their work in assembly this week talking about rules in school and what makes a good friend. They were all very happy and confident to show case their work and talk about what they have learnt.

Fox class have continued practising their number songs and exploring the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. They have made caterpillars in Art and very much enjoyed making some caterpillar cakes to eat. In our PE session we used the parachute whilst singing some songs linked to our topic of in the garden.



This week Dormouse Class have been working so hard on developing our finer motor skills. Practising using our hands across a range of contexts. We have especially explored roots this week, feeling slimy spaghetti roots and using wool to pull through paint to create some fantastic pictures. Additionally, the children all used amazing eye pointing or touch skills to select which colours and strands they would like to use to create their pictures. It was brilliant to see the range of designs children came up with! Our sit-to-stand group has continued with success and the children are working so hard on their core strength, in particular, working on keeping their torsos upright when standing with minimal support. The children all looked incredible in their Superhero outfits on Thursday and we had everything from the Hulk to Spiderman! It was wonderful to celebrate all our incredible Dormice on Rare Diseases Day and we think they deserve celebrating every day!



In Squirrel class this week the children continued with their topic on The Very Hungry. In literacy they have been getting more familiar with the different stages of the caterpillar's life and the different food it was feeding on. The children practiced character recognition and matching the same characters. In phonics they continued to practice sound recognition of S, A, T, P, I, N. In maths they have been counting caterpillars up to five and deepened their number knowledge. They also continued to practice matching numbers to quantities up to 5.


Emails will be monitored between 8:00am – 3:45pm, Monday – Friday during term time only by admin staff
