Dear Parents and Carers

I hope you had a good Easter break.

The children have returned refreshed and I am sure some have grown over the break!

Yesterday there was much excitement in Saxon Wood as we had a visit form an international chocolatier. He brought a range of resources that were differentiated for each class, ensuring all children could participate. Some enjoyed tasting the chocolate and making chocolate treats. Others enjoyed feeling the objects and smelling the chocolate. Every child had a little treat to take home. I think the staff were just as excited as the children were. We had a visit from Alan Rowden, our Chair of Governors, who got the opportunity to make chocolate lollipop too!!

Learning environments:

This term I have been working with staff to develop our classroom and outdoor areas. As this progresses, I will ensure we show you some photos.

We are looking for any natural objects you may have at home that you no longer need. Or any pots and pans, little baskets, off-cuts of wood, drainpipes, etc. We are also looking for non-poisonous plants too. Please feel free to speak with myself or a member of staff if you think you have something at home that we could upcycle and use in school. You would be surprised at what we could adapt to create wonderful learning environments for our children! Thank you in advance.

Unfortunately we had to cancel our last Swings and Smiles session over the Easter break due to lack of interest.

I have been liaising with Swings and Smiles about offering another session during the next half term break. This will take place on Tuesday 28th May 2024 between 11:00 - 1:00pm. Learning at Saxon Wood:

It is always an honour and privilege to visit each class throughout the week to find out what they are learning.

Fox class have begun their new topic for this term which is 'On the farm.' In literacy we have been learning the story of the Little Red Hen. In phonics we have used the resonance board to make farm animal sounds and in art have made some farm animals out of lots of fluffy materials which we will display in class. In maths we have practised recognising our numbers 1-5 and arranging objects up to 5. In PE we tried our best at catching balls nearby and using tennis rackets. The children very much enjoyed their visit from an international chocolate consultant and made their own chocolate lolly pops.



Badger Class have enjoyed playing a game of 'what's in the box?' to try and decipher who the author of our book this half term was. We learnt that not only did the author write lots of amazing books, he was also once a spy and invented over 250 words! I wonder if the children can tell you his name? We have also begun to explore different types of instructions and their purpose to help us know how to write our own in a few weeks. In maths, children have been working hard securing their understanding of number and have been doing great work practising sounding and blending words. We have also enjoyed doing some reading everyday and talking to each other about what we have read. Badger Class were also treated to a brilliant workshop from a chocolatier and we got to make our own chocolate lollies! Well done Badger Class for a great first week back!



Hedgehog class have come back to school happy and ready to learn. They have been great friends helping a new pupil settle into Hedgehog class. In literacy we have started to read Charlie and the Chocolate Factory which the children are really enjoying listening to. We have also been thinking about questions we could ask before and during reading the book which the children really embraced and come up with some great questions. In maths we are looking at the value of a number, and the different representations of a number. The children have been recognising numbers, knowing how many objects needed for a given number and finding the number on a dice. In phonics the children have been looking at the 'ow' & 'ue' grapheme. They played splat the word, matching objects to pictures and words, then spelling the objects they have found using monster phonics magnetic letters. In our topic we had a very exciting visitor come to school and teach us all about the history of chocolate. How it is made from harvesting the cacao beans, to the chocolate being made in the factory. We had lots to look at and smell and we were even shown how to taste chocolate to get the 1500 flavours that are in a piece of chocolate. The children had great fun making their own chocolate lolly pop.



Dormouse Class have begun their new unit on "Rumble in the Jungle". We have loved exploring natural objects in our outdoor area, exploring leaves and sticks as part of a Tuff Tray activity and have also begun learning about sounds stopping and starting. We love our new Phonics songs and the grownups were so impressed with the children's engagement!



Squirrel Class have settled back into school well and our new topic "On the farm" is already in full swing. This week the children got familiar with their new story "Farmer duck". In literacy and phonics we looked at different farm animals and the sounds they make, supported with "Old McDonald had a farm" nursery rhyme. The children were using verbal communication or pre-recorded communication switches to identify the animals and their sounds. In maths we continued to develop the children's number recognition by counting farm animals then choosing the matching number. We had a special visitor this week, a chocolatier who brought many delicious treats and allowed us to make rice crispy cakes. The children enjoyed their first Move Momentum session this morning and have started making some farmyard art.

I hope you all have a good weekend. Please remember, my door is always open if you have any concerns or any ideas you would like to discuss. If I am in a meeting, I will always find time to get back to you as soon as possible


Emails will be monitored between 8:00am – 3:45pm, Monday – Friday during term time only by admin staff
